



Carillon Beach- Beach Recreational Fires Policy

This policy will serve as guidelines and parameters for beach “Recreational Fires” (bonfires) in Carillon Beach. All points in the policy are with the goal of maximizing safety and consistency in our community. All “Recreational Fires” guidelines are in alignment with Bay County Ordinances and are overseen by the Association and it’s Beach Service Partner, La Dolce Vita (“LDV”).

- All Carillon Beach “Recreational Fires” must be set up and monitored by the community approved vendor, LDV, who will file with Bay County Fire Department. This policy applies to all lot owners and renters, including gulf front owners, hosting “Recreational Fires” on their property.
- Those desiring to have a Recreational Fire should reach out to LDV to schedule and pay. Rates charged shall be in accordance with LDV’s then existing rates. LDV will, in turn, reserve all dates for “Recreational Fires” through the HOA Offices.
- Recreational Fires with attendees in excess of thirty (30) and up to eighty (80) (“Large Group Recreational Fires”) shall be subject to additional fees payable to the HOA (See Exhibit A- Fee Schedule). The Fee Schedule may be updated from time to time by the Board of Directors and appended to this rule which rates shall be effective upon adoption.
- Only 2 “Recreational Fires” shall be allowed on the beach at any time.
- “Recreational Fires” of 51 or more people will be required to have an Off Duty Bay County Sheriff’s Deputy to be onsite for the event. The HOA will administrate this process with the party booking the fire. The individual booking the fire will be responsible for payment to the HOA, which will then secure the deputy. The bonfire will not be authorized until payment confirmation is verified. Rates charged will be in accordance with the standard rates charged by Bay County as of the date of the reservation.
- Maximum capacity of all “Recreational Fires” will be 80 people.
- Only 1 “Recreational Fire” per night of 50 or more people will be allowed.

- Homeowners and renters of an interior lot will use the beach area behind the Beach Club Pool or service hut locations on the beach (Walkover 2 or Walkover 7) for their “Recreational Fires”.
- Homeowners and renters of beach front homes may have “Recreational Fires” adjacent to their property, subject to the rules and regulations contained herein.
- All “Recreational Fires” equipment must be removed by 10:00 p.m. and the beach restored to original condition by LDV.
- All “Recreational Fires” must be 50 ft. away from all dune vegetation.
- “Recreational Fires” are not permitted if winds reach 25 mph or if Bay County has issued a burn ban notice.
- Any “Recreational Fires” that do not follow these rules and regulations as per Bay County and Carillon Beach HOA will be subject to immediate suspension and such other enforcement mechanisms available pursuant to the Declaration and Florida law.

Fees for Large Group Recreational Fires:

31+ people	\$150
41+ people	\$250
51+ people	\$500 (Sheriff required for separate fee)
61+ people	\$750 (Sheriff required for separate fee)
