

Carillon Beach Campfires

Rules and Regulations

Bay County has implemented policies for conducting “Campfires” on the beach. In order to increase the enjoyment of Carillon Beach by Association Members, the Carillon Beach Association will conduct a one year trial of Campfires following the Policy and Rules established below. The Board believes these rules and regulations are necessary to ensure that campfires are conducted in a safe manner and in a way that will minimize negative impact on other owners and guests utilizing the beach. On May 31, 2020, or sooner if the Board deems necessary, the Board will review the results of the trial and take a formal vote to either extend or terminate the authorization of Campfires in Carillon Beach.

- All Carillon Beach campfires must have a valid permit from the Bay County Emergency Services Dept. (located in the Fire Department).
- All Carillon Beach campfires must have an approved permit from the Carillon Beach Homeowners Association (sample attached)
- Date for campfires must be reserved through the HOA Manager along with submission of the Bay County Emergency Service permit. Any and all HOA fees must be paid in full prior to HOA approval.
- Bay County permits and Carillon Beach permits must be posted at the campfire site at the time of the campfire.
- All campfires must be set up and monitored by (insert company name) which is the exclusive vendor in Carillon Beach. Said company must follow all Bay County and Carillon Beach rules and regulations for campfires.
- Only one campfire shall be allowed on the beach at any time. Only two total Campfires shall be permitted per week.
- Homeowners of an interior lot shall use the beach area behind the beach club pool for their campfires.
- Homeowners of beach front homes may have campfires adjacent to their property if they follow all above rules and regulations of Bay County and Carillon Beach HOA.
- A homeowner must be present during all times of the campfire. Renters and homeowner guests are not permitted to have campfires at Carillon Beach.
- Tiki-Torches are prohibited per the Carillon Beach rules and regulations.
- All campfire equipment must be removed by 10:00 p.m. and beach restored to original condition.
- Any campfires not following these rules and regulations as per Bay County and Carillon Beach will be subject to immediate campfire suspension and such other enforcement mechanisms available pursuant to the Declaration and Florida law.
